Developing Educational and Training Strategy for Supply Chain Skills in Indonesia

- development of an action paper on supply chain skills and training strategy in Indonesia;

Progress to date

The project on Supply Chain Skills Challenge was undertaken in 2017 in collaboration with RMIT University, Association of Logistics Indonesia (ALI), Institute of Sepuluh November Surabaya (ITS) and University of Indonesia (UI).

The initial report was presented at the CeMAT conference, Jakarta, in 2017 and a follow up report was presented at the CeMAT conference, Jakarta in 2018.
